Housing and Meals: Participants stay at one of the 19 residence halls on-campus. You can select catered or non-catered accommodations, although students do receive a meal plan for their stay. Each hall includes kitchen and bathroom on each floor, furnished room with bed, wardrobe, desk, and chair, free wireless internet access, and 24-hour security. Some halls have a sink and shared access to a common room.

Arrival and Orientation: Participants will be picked up from the airport and taken to their accommodations. Afterwards, students will be introduced to important facility on-campus during the week-long orientation. Also, tours will be given around campus.

Costs: Amounts are in US dollars. Some costs may be approximate due to the changing value of the US dollar against international currencies.
