Areas of Assistance:

- Scholarships
- Financial aid
- Loans
- Savings
- Travel campaign (Fundmytravel.com OR Gofundme.com)

Tips from Fox Business:

- Plan early and break down costs
- Apply for as many scholarships or grants as you can
- Find alternative aid sources

When students apply with Winthrop:

- Students pay Winthrop tuition with Winthrop Affiliated programs while they are abroad. Meals and room and board are sometimes covered with certain Winthrop affiliated programs.
- Student's financial aid and scholarships *should* travel with them. It is best for students to contact the Office of Financial Aid, each case is different.
- The Office of National and Competitive Awards (ONCA) offers study abroad scholarships, and the English department offers a specific one as well.
- The study abroad portal is a good resource for research.

General Scholarships:

Ashley Soulé Conroy Foundation Scholarship

- Submit your application via mail/email at least 10 days before the deadline to ensure full consideration can be made of your application.

- **Application Deadline:**

- o Fall Semester: July 1
- o Spring Semester: December 1
- Amount Awarded: \$4,000

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship Program

- Awards ranging \$8,000-\$20,000
- Student must be a US Citizen.
- Student must be a Pell Grant Recipient
- Preference given to long term abroad students
- **Deadline for Spring and Summer 2018: Oct 3**

Boren Scholarships

- Students interested in studying less commonly taught languages or in underrepresented study abroad countries
- Applying to a study abroad program that is outside of Western Europe, The United States, Canada, New Zealand, or Australia.
- Must be a US Citizen at the time of applying.
- Study abroad programs for two or more semesters are encouraged.
- Must work for the Federal Government one year after graduation
- **Deadline: February 8, 2018**

Corinne Jeannine Schillings Foundation

- Travel Study Awards through the CJS foundation are available to Silver or Gold Award Girl Scouts who plan to study abroad.
- Eligibility
 - o A current or former girl scout.
 - o Must have 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
 - o **Deadline Dec. 8, 2017**

Critical Language Scholarship Program

- Open to all US undergraduates and graduates in every field.
- For students interested in a language and cultural immersion program overseas, who are interested in mastering a critical language.
- Languages offered: Chinese, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Azerbaijani, Russian, Turkish, Arabic, Bangla, Hindi, Persian, Punjabi, Urdu, and Swahili. (You do not get to pick your country)
 - o Some languages require a minimum time of previous study.
- Undergraduates must have completed one academic year.
- No minimum GPA required for applicants
- Requires two letters of recommendation and a transcript
- Award varies

Cultural Bridge Scholarship

- US undergraduate students with plans to study in Europe-must already have been accepted to study abroad by office
- Minimum of 3.0 GPA
- Award Amount: \$500
- Questionnaire and 1-3 minute video application

Deadline: August 31, 2017

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) Undergraduate Scholarship

- For qualified undergraduate students that need funding for study, senior thesis research and/or internships in Germany.
- Preference will be given to students whose projects or programs are based at and organized by a German university.
- Scholarships are available either as part of an organized study abroad program or an independent study abroad semester or year.
- Eligibility
 - o Second or third year student going in to your third or fourth year.
 - o Student has a well-defined study, research or internship plans for their stay in Germany.
 - o Student demonstrates an interest in contemporary German and European affairs and who explain the significance of their project in Germany to their future studies, research or professional goals.
 - o Student will return to the US to complete their B.A. after the scholarship period.
- Award
 - o What can be funded?
 - ☐ Study abroad & exchanges
 - ☐ Internships of 3 months or less as part of a semester of study abroad.
 - ☐ Internships of up to 10 months that are a mandatory and integral part of the course of studies
 - ☐ Senior thesis research stays
 - o Duration of scholarship

- ☐ Scholarships may be granted for a minimum of one semester and a one academic year.
- ☐ The scholarship period must take place during the German academic year
- Value
- ☐ Monthly stipend of €650, health, accident and liability insurance, travel allowance.

Generation Study Abroad Excellence and Travel Awards (New Zealand)

- Eligibility Criteria
 - Must be a US citizen or hold US residency status.
 - Sophomore or higher
 - Minimum of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
 - 18 years or older
- Education New Zealand Study Abroad Travel Awards (ENZTA) offers \$2,000 to help students fund their flight to New Zealand.
- Generation Study Abroad New Zealand Universities Excellence Awards (NZUEA) offer \$500 for studying at one of the eight New Zealand universities.
- Generation Study Abroad New Zealand Institutes of Technology and Polytechnics Excellence Awards (NZITPEA) offers \$500 for studying at participating institutes of technology and polytechnics.
- **Deadline for Spring: Dec 1**
- **Deadline for Fall: April 30**

Go Overseas Study and Intern Abroad Scholarship

- Applicants must submit a photo essay and quick survey to enter and follow @GoOverseas on Instagram
- Eligibility:
 - Undergraduate or graduate student.
 - Student must be enrolled full-time at an institution based in the U.S.
- Award amount: \$500
- **Deadline Sept. 1**

Jane Gluckmann & Carol Rausch Go Global Scholarship

- This scholarship will be awarded to one student each year planning to study abroad in Mexico, Central America, South America, France, or Germany.
- US undergraduate student that will receive credit for their home university.
- Program must include at least four weeks.
- **Deadline for 2018-2019 semesters: January 10**

LIVFund Scholarship

- Offers scholarships in 21 countries including Argentina, Belize, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Puerto Rico, Uruguay and Venezuela.

- Anyone over the age of 18 interested in learning, interning or volunteering abroad in Latin America.
- Candidates coming to Latin America with an organized program, designing their own program or still waiting to be accepted to an abroad program are all eligible to apply.
- Eligibility:
 - o Must agree to post at least three [3] blog entries on the LIVFund blog detailing their abroad experience.

Live Like Ally Foundation

- Eligibility
 - o Must be 15 – 23 years old
- LLAFF does not make grants to individuals: your initial request must include an established organization that provides a guided experience aligned with your goals. LLAFF does not provide scholarships to schools for direct tuition or tuition but, organizations providing study abroad programs would be considered eligible for LLAFF awards.
- Individuals receiving an LLAFF grant will be asked to send monthly status reports, including written reflection, photos, video links, etc.
- Awardees will be highlighted on the LLAFF website which may include the awardee-provided content. This material may be used in social media or other LLAFF promotional channels
- The amount awarded is solely at the discretion of LLAFF and will be based on program costs and the awardees financial needs, up to \$10,000.

National Security Education Program / David L. Boren Undergraduate Scholarships

- U.S. undergraduate students participating in study abroad programs in world regions critical to US interests (including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America & the Caribbean, and the Middle East), in exchange for a commitment to seek work in the federal government. The countries of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand are excluded.
- Eligibility:
 - o Must be an undergraduate student who have not yet completed their degree.

Student Exchange Support Program (Scholarship for Short-term Study in Japan)

- Eligibility:
 - o Student OS accepted by Japanese school under a student exchange agreement or other student exchange arrangement with their home school.
 - o Students not having the financial means to study in Japan.
 - o Student cannot receive any other scholarship from the Japanese government together with this scholarship.
- Award: Monthly Stipend of \$800.00

Tortuga Backpacks Study Abroad Scholarship

- Eligibility
 - o Must be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or currently studying in the US on a student visa.
 - o Full-time undergraduate student
 - o Have applied to or been accepted into a study abroad program eligible for credit by your college or university.
- Winner receives
 - o \$1,000
 - o One Tortuga or Tortuga Air
- o **Deadline for Spring 2018:** December 20, 2017
- o **Deadline for Fall 2018:** May 20, 2018

US-Japan Bridging Foundation Scholarships

- US undergraduate student studying abroad in Japan.
- Japanese prerequisite is not a qualification.
- Must stay in Japan for at least 3 months and earn credit that will transfer back to their school in the US.
- Award Amount:
 - o \$2,500 for a semester
 - o \$4,000 for an academic year
- Deadline: Oct. 11**

Fellowships:

American Association of University Women Fellowships and Grants

- Requirements:

- Each fellowship or grant has its own requirements, but all are only available to women
- Must be a graduate student.
- Award: Varies between \$2,000 and \$30,000.

Blakemore Freeman Fellowships for Asian Language Study

- Must be a US citizen or a permanent resident.
- Applicant must have an undergraduate degree.
- Be pursuing a professional, business, technical or academic career that involves the regular use of a modern East or Southeast Asian language.
- Fellowships cover basic expenses at a graduate student level necessary to pursue an academic year of full-time intensive language study in Asia, including tuition or tutoring fees, plus a stipend for travel, living and study expenses. Tuition for the language program, and tutoring fees (if applicable) are covered in full.

Laura W, Bush Travelling Fellowship

- The student will conduct brief work in a foreign country related to the mandate of UNESCO – using education, natural sciences, social and human sciences, culture, and/or communication and information to build strong ties among nations.
- Student must be at least 18 and no older than 25.
- The length of time for travel is between 4 and 6 weeks.
- Evaluation Criteria:
 - Originality and feasibility of the proposal.
 - Quality of the essay.
 - Apparent dedication to bridging nations, enlarging freedoms, and promoting democracy through one or more of UNESCO's fields of competence.
- Average Award Amount: \$2,500

Luce Scholars Program

- Students who already have significant experience in Asia or Asian studies are not eligible for the Luce Scholars Program.
- Must have earned at least a bachelor's degree or reasonably expect to receive that degree by July 1st of the year they enter the program.

- Must demonstrate an outstanding capacity for leadership, have a record of high achievement, and have mature and clearly defined career interests with evidence of potential for professional accomplishments. All fields will be considered.
- A nominating institution may submit three nominations for each year's Luce Scholars competition. **Deadline for**

Grants:

submission is November 1. The Foundation cannot accept applications submitted directly by individual candidates.

Fulbright English Teaching Assistantships (ETAs)

- Selected participants work for one academic year in a school or university in a foreign country in Europe, Asia, or South America, assisting in the teaching of English language and American culture.
- Requirements
 - o U.S. Resident in good physical health.
 - o Must have a B.A.
 - o Must have proficiency writing and speaking language of host country.
- Award: The grants cover transportation costs, housing, and accident and sickness.

Fulbright Travel Grants

- To pay round trip travel expenses to study abroad programs in Germany, Hungary, Italy in cases where the cost of travel is not covered by the program fees.
- Eligibility
 - o Graduate student
 - o U.S. resident in good physical health with bachelor's degree (or equivalent).
 - o Must have proficiency writing and speaking language of host country
- Award: Determined by the need of applicant.

Phi Kappa Phi

- Grants awarding up to \$1,000 each
- Student must attend an undergraduate institution with an active Phi Kappa Phi chapter.
- Student must have at least a 3.75 GPA and be accepted into a program already.
- The study abroad program must begin between:
 - o Session A: May 1, 2017 – November 30, 2017
 - o Session B: December 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018
- **Application Deadline:**
 - o Session A: February 15, 2017
 - o Session B: September 15, 2017

- API First Generation Scholarship

- Undergraduate Students who are the first in their families to attend a college or university.
- Student has a cumulative GPA of a 2.75.
- Student demonstrates financial need.
- Award Amount Range: \$250 - \$750

- Undergraduate students who are studying science, mathematics, engineering or technology.

- **Gilman Scholarship Match**

- AIFS will award an additional \$500 to each student who receives a Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship and uses it toward an AIFS semester or academic year catalog program, or \$250 toward a summer catalog program.

- **John S. Linakis Scholarship**

- Awarded to an AIFS student with limited financial resources and demonstrates an interest in social justice, studying in the spring academic semester.
- Scholarship covers: tuition, room and board.
- **Deadline: October 1, 2017**

- **Russel and Deborah Taylor Foundation Scholarship**

- Students who demonstrate academic excellence and significant financial need.
- Cumulative 3.5 GPA

- Only offers aid for semester or summer, not an academic year.
- Award range from \$250-\$1,000

- **CISabroad Digital Storyteller Scholarship (Semester programs only)**
 - Students will blog or vlog during their study abroad experience using either WordPress or YouTube.
 - Upon return students will work in coordination with CISabroad marketing team on their overseas experience.
 - Amount Awarded: \$500 - \$1000.
- **CISabroad Gives Back Scholarship**
 - Students who are interested in or have an academic focus in conservation, community development, or sustainability. Recipients will arrange and participate in at least two volunteer opportunities while overseas and make a presentation, video, blog, or vlog on their experience upon returning home.
 - Amount Awarded: \$250
- **CISabroad Social Media Guru**
 - Recipients will be required to take part in an Instagram takeover as well as provide content for other CISabroad social platforms.
 - Amount Awarded: \$250
- **CISabroad Wanderlust Scholarship**
 - This scholarship is intended for students who are among the first from their U.S. University to go abroad on any CISabroad program.
 - Recipients will work in coordination with the CISabroad Marketing Team to develop a plan for sharing their story while abroad. Options may include photos, Instagram takeover, videos, or a blog. Recipients will be expected to submit 5 - 10 pieces.

USAC Scholarships

- **First Generation Scholarship**

- Any student that will be the first individual in their family to graduate from college is eligible
- Awards: Multiple awards will be given in the amount of \$750-\$1,000.

- **Frank and Thu Triplett Study Abroad Scholarship (France)**

- Students attending the Lyon or Pau, France programs are eligible to apply for this scholarship which will be awarded each fall and spring semester.

- **Kody Bressman Memorial Scholarship (San Sebastián, Spain)**

- Students participating in a San Sebastián program with a minimum GPA of 2.75 are eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- Multiple awards ranging from \$500-\$2,500 will be awarded each semester.

- **Massey University Scholarship (New Zealand)**

- Applicants to any of Massey's campus locations in New Zealand—Palmerston North, Auckland, or Wellington—are eligible.
