



# Travel Seminar: Authentic China



Students will obtain great insight into China's civilization, foreign relations, and economic development from the past to the present in both metropolitan and rural areas, and both political and economic capitals. In the spring semester, the subjects will cover the First Emperor's myths and achievements, the cosmopolitan Tang Empire's promotion of Buddhism and Silk Road trade, the construction of the Forbidden City in Beijing, and the 20th-century Chinese revolutions. Students will be able to apply these learnings in the May trip to distinguish between authentic China and the images in Hollywood movies and other mass media.

Visit the Longmen Grottoes, which houses 100,000 Buddhist statues within the 2,345 caves, and the Shaolin Temple, the icon of Chinese martial arts
