



International Service Learning in History/ Human Nutrition in the Developing World



This course is an interdisciplinary overview of Nicaragua's history (with a special focus on the rural area of Matiguas and the communities of Rocha and Tierra Blanca), focusing on its history since independence with an emphasis on the 20th century, as well as the geography, and the human population demographics of Nicaragua. This course is unique in that history students will learn simultaneously with nutrition students who will be traveling to Nicaragua in the same group. Although history and nutrition students will undertake discipline-specific projects, they will participate in some shared experiences and service projects in the classroom as well as in Nicaragua.
