As Jönköping University is located in the city center, all international student residences (Gräshagen, Dalvik, Vilhemsro and Råslätt) are within 25 minutes by public transport from the university. In each apartment, students stay in single or double rooms with up to 6 students sharing a living/kitchen area. Bedrooms come equipped with a bed, bed quilt, pillow, closet or wardrobe (no bed linens or towels). Students have access to a laundry room. Kitchen facilities include a fridge and often kitchen items. There is no meal plan in this program, however the university has an affordable cafeteria open during school hours.
